

Resizing and Cropping Images for web

If you are replacing an existing image you will first want to determine the dimensions in order to know what size you need to match. Continue on to “Getting the image dimensions”

If this is a new image you can define your own width and jump to “Cropping and Resizing”

Getting the image dimensions

1. Go to the web page where the image is displayed.
2. **Right Click** on the image and select **Properties**.
3. Make note of these values.

In the Internet Explorer browser they look like this


Dimensions: 161 x 214 pixels

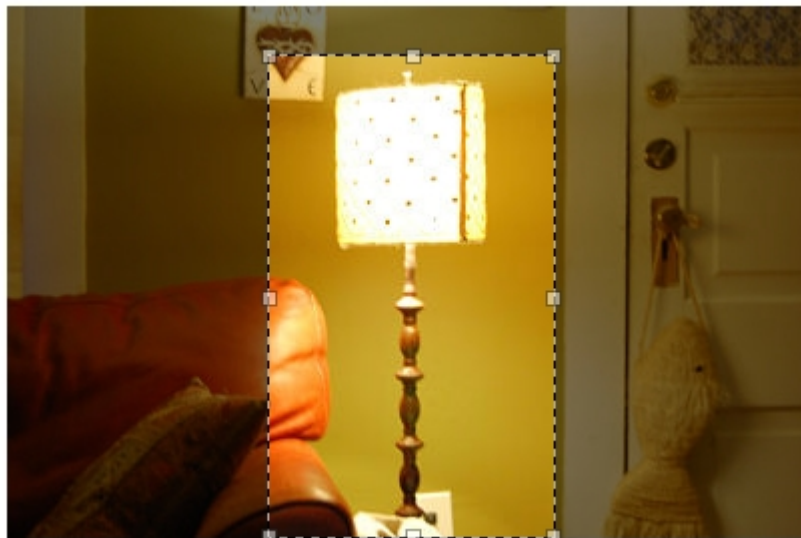
The first value is the width in pixels and the second value is the height in pixels.

Now you are ready to move on to cropping and resizing the image

Cropping and Resizing

1. Go to <http://webresizer.com/resizer/> (this is an online image editing tool)
2. Click the **Browse** button, find and click on the image you want to resize
3. Click **Upload Image** button
(This could take a while if your original image is large. You will see two versions of your image appear when done)

4. Click on  [Crop Image](#)
5. Resize the box on your image by clicking and dragging the dots to select the area you want to crop



6. Click **Apply Changes** button to crop the image
7. Go down to the New size field and type in the width value that you noted in the first part of these instructions or enter your desired width if this is a new image.

New size: width height (5 to 800)

(make sure that the width is selected)

(If you are adding a new image to your site, the width should anywhere from 200 to 500)

8. Click **Apply Changes** button

9. Click on [download this image](#)

(make sure to note where it is saving the image on your computer)

That's it! You are now ready to use the image on your site.
